


2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT



"Prepare the way of the Lord." - Mk 1:3

Over Pentecost Weekend in 2022 an Archdiocesan Synod, an official gathering of clergy, religious, and lay faithful from across the Archdiocese was held under the direction of Archbishop Hebda. Though not the first such Synod in our Local Church's history, it was the first to be held in over ninety years. At Sacred Heart, the fruit of this Synod has been the creation of a Synod Evangelization Team aka SET comprising twelve members of our Parish. This group gathered together for the first time in January of 2023. Within this group of twelve there is smaller team of three, known as the Executive Cell Team aka the ECT, that continues to provide leadership for the SET and for our parish in bringing about the first priority Archbishop Hebda identified in his Post-Synodal letter: **You Will Be My Witnesses**, namely, to make the dream of Small-Group ministry a reality in every parish of our Archdiocese. To that end an invitation was made in September 2023 to the parish at large for parishioners to come forward to receive training and formation in small group ministry. Nearly, forty souls participated in this larger effort the last few months. Work continues with this larger group of disciples to make Archbishop Hebda's dream a reality for the Church of the Sacred Heart. Below follow an update from our ECT about where we are at here at the Church of the Sacred Heart.

An Update from the Synod Evangelization Team of Sacred Heart:

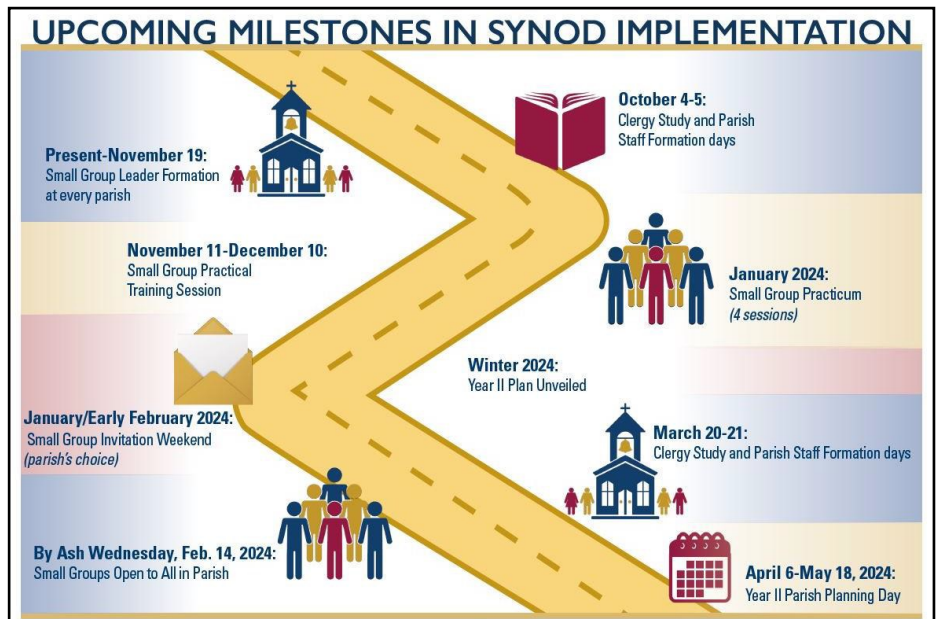
THE SYNOD TEAM WISHES ALL ADVENT PEACE AND CHRISTMAS BLESSINGS

When appointed to the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, Archbishop Bernard A. Hebda followed through on a recommendation he made as Apostolic Administrator to whomever would succeed Archbishop Nienstedt as Archbishop. It just so happened that the successor would also be Archbishop Hebda. That counsel was to hold an Archdiocesan Synod, an opportunity to listen to the clergy, religious and laity of the archdiocese to help shape the direction and pastoral priorities of our local church, the

Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. Interpreting the results, Archbishop Hebda wrote a letter to his flock detailing a mission and timeline entitled **You will be my Witnesses** from the mandate of Jesus at the time of the Ascension. <https://archspm.org/synodletter> (written and option with podcast for listening) The archbishop's first priority has been for his archdiocese to become "parishes of small groups." To fulfill this goal, the Archdiocese has adopted a model for small groups in parishes originating in the Archdiocese of Milan, Italy. The model, know as "Parish Evangelization Cells System aka PECS," has been shown, worldwide, to profoundly facilitate growth in parishes while deepening faith in the members and has been adopted by this archdiocese. United in prayer, Father Pedersen has led Sacred Heart Parish through several steps in the implementation of Synod goals. Recently, approximately thirty of our parishioners completed an archdiocesan led seven-week "Small Group Leader Formation Series." This entailed studying the early Church and how the disciples followed the path of Jesus in a way of life akin to small groups. The study, further, contributed to an understanding of small groups through the PECS model. Reaching the end of our Liturgical Year, we celebrated on November 30th, the Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle. Andrew and John were followers of John the Baptist, awaiting the coming of the Messiah. When John the Baptist exclaimed, "Behold the Lamb of God," Andrew and John followed Jesus and asked Him where He was staying. Jesus said to them, "Come and See." This has been a guiding light for the fulfilling the first priority coming from the Archdiocesan Synod. (John 1:35-39) This is the invitation that the archdiocese is extending to each of us and asking us to extend to others. The intention, in our New Apostolic age, is "the transformation of our parish culture to meet the transformation of the culture in which we live." We go forward to proclaim the Good News of Salvation through a method that is inviting, joyful, healing and restorative, giving Glory to God! Much more will begin to happen in a visible sense beginning in January 2024. Through the workings of the Holy Spirit, many creative ideas have been suggested by the group of parishioners formed to lead small groups at Sacred Heart accompanied by their impressive willingness to serve to make Archbishop Hebda's dream a reality. This commitment of your fellow parishioners has the capacity to set into motion full parish involvement. We will be ready for small groups in February, and we look forward to what God has in store for a Church "more fully alive" through small-group ministry and discipleship.

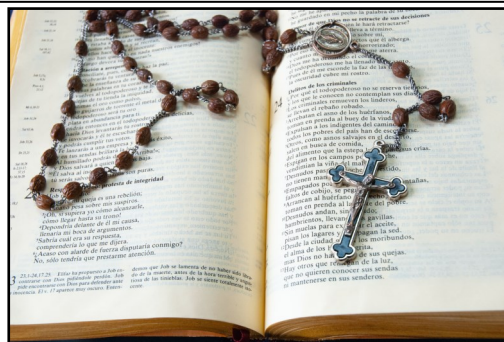

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We like to think we are totally free, but the bitter truth is we simply are not. Or better put, our freedom is limited on every side — by governments, corporate giants, physical and mental frailties, genetic shortcomings, and even the boundaries of time and space, and above all, the burden of our sins and pending deaths. In our day, we are perhaps particularly aware that we are not free to disconnect from the technocratic rulers of the air. If you doubt me, try not paying your internet bill and see what happens. We are not totally free.

It's nothing new, of course. In Jesus' day, everyone felt the crushing weight of the Roman Empire. You can say you're free all you want. But try not paying your taxes to Rome and see what happens.

Once we feel this burden in our own lives — however it comes — we are ready to hear the stunning announcement that commences Mark's gospel, **"The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God."** It's not a simple perfunctory introduction, but a dramatic announcement of new freedom. The word "gospel" was a political, even military, term. It meant: a great victory has been won and a new king is in charge. This Jesus — not the Roman emperor — is God's son, and he has defeated all that crushes human freedom. It's time to follow him and be truly free. This week let's refuse to submit our freedom to false rulers — especially that of sin. And let's rejoice that Christ is coming to make us perfectly free from all our oppressors.

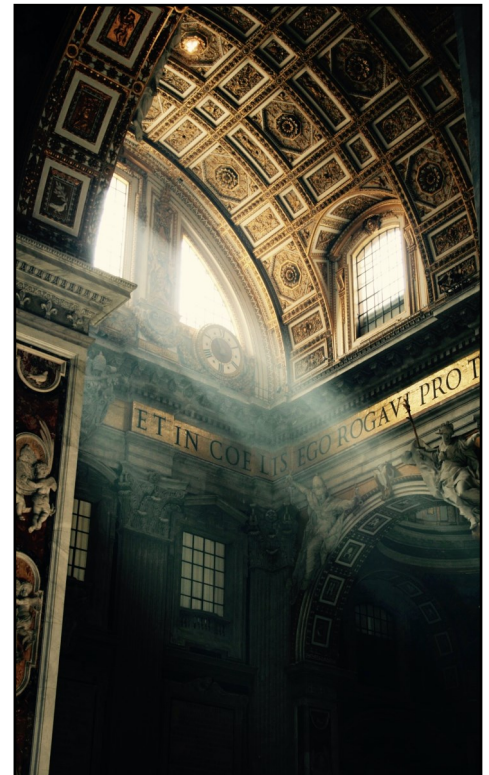
