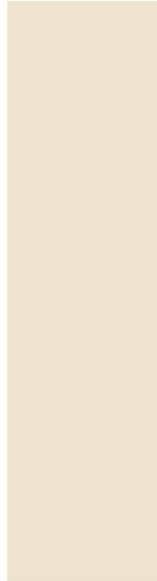

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

My parents' garage is full of old junk that no longer serves any purpose in my life. As a 46-year-old man, I admit that's pretty lame. Either due to my sentimentality or laziness (or both, probably), I just couldn't get myself to throw things away. But a few days ago, by a grace of God, I thought: "I'll hire my nephew Ryan to throw a bunch of my stuff away — he couldn't care less about my junk!" And you know what? It worked. In one day, Ryan chucked the majority of his uncle's useless stuff. I feel so free, ready for a new junk-free chapter in my life.

This kind of thing happens in this Sunday's Gospel. Peter's net is full of useless junk. Luke says he and the others are cleaning their nets after catching no fish. Imagine them dejectedly and impatiently removing a nasty assortment of seaweed, sticks and muck. The Lord teaches and calls them once their nets are cleared out. So it goes with us. Spiritual life begins by removing that which is useless and merely taking up space in our hearts, minds and lives. Then Jesus teaches and acts in a marvelous way in our lives, too.

So what's junking up your net? What habits, attachments, possessions, preoccupations? If, like me, you struggle to clean your nets by yourself, ask the Lord to send you someone like my nephew to be your "Peter" and help you clean it out. It is well worth it. Once Peter's net is clean, he is free to make a wonderful catch.

Honoring Sacramental Marriage

"a man leaves his father and his mother and cleaves to his wife, and they become one flesh"

(Gen 2:24)

At Sacred Heart Parish in Robbinsdale, there is a long-standing tradition of honoring marriage during the month of March. The altar of Saint Joseph, the patron of the "Survived 25 Club," is adorned on the weekend closest to his March 19 Feast Day with an image of the betrothal of Joseph and Mary accompanied by the names of those married for 25 years and longer arranged by anniversary dates and decades. A banner displays, "St. Joseph Pray for Us," in this celebration of the fidelity to marriage.



In 2006, two couples of the parish, Anne and Charlie Hedlund with Laurel and Mike Murry, began this ministry. Anne had just been with her husband on a 30th wedding anniversary trip in 2004 to Hawaii, and at the conclusion of a local weekend Mass, the priest asked all anniversary couples to stand to receive a special blessing. This brought to Anne an awareness of the universality of the Church, so far away from home, and yet celebrating what is most important. On the return to her home parish, she presented to the pastor who already had an active young married couples' group, her wish to give recognition to those who have also been married for a longer time. He encouraged a once a year display to honor the blessings and successes in the longevity of marriage, pleased that this would also be a witness to the younger couples to work through life's circumstances towards the blessed goal of a long, holy, and happy marriage. She was joined by her parishioner friend, Laurel, and the tradition has continued.

"Amazingly," states Anne, "we have 9 couples over those years that celebrated 70 or more years of marriage; the longest one, married in 1947, being married 76 years in 2023." She smiles, "There is always a little competition going on! All of this would have been hidden if these beautiful marriages had not been brought to the forefront."

Anne and Laurel took it upon themselves to do extras. Brochures were made to portray the beauty, dignity, and great depth of marriage as they answer to error and fight for truth. For instance, "Nuggets of Wisdom" was written at the time of a Supreme Court Ruling that debated the very meaning of marriage. There have been meal gatherings, Cana Dinners with speakers, articles on canonized married couples in recognition of World Marriage Day, prayer/holy cards with marriage help and enrichment info/websites placed on the altar for the congregation, and prayer and memorial requests recognized for deceased spouses.

God the Father chose St. Joseph to protect Mary and Jesus. Saints and popes have recognized his great intercessory power as spiritual father. This one small idea and service by two parish couples is a witness to the noble vocation of love, "Marriage," and accompanies us on our journey back to Our Father in heaven, keeping always, "what is most important" central and fruitful.
