Worship & Meditation



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

"As he rode along, the people were spreading their cloaks on the road." (Luke 19:36)

Consider how useless it is to spread your clothes on the ground for a donkey to walk on. The clothes get smeared with hooves, and who knows the grimy places where they've been? The animal may leave some unsavory presents on them. They may get stolen by a thief looking to make a buck. The thorns, thistles, rocks and muck of the road will leave stains. The clothes may never be useful again, and you'll probably walk home shivering without your normal covering. Yet this is precisely the gesture the people employ to welcome Jesus and his donkey. Why does this detail matter?

Wastefulness is an essential part of celebration. Consider the unnecessary extravagance of Christmas decorations, confetti and ticker tape parades, baseball players spraying each other with bottles of champagne after a victory, birthday gifts for kids and so on. This wastefulness signals celebration and therefore participation in higher identities (as believers, winners, and parents, to mention the above examples). That's what the wasted cloaks are all about. Those who donate their cloaks participate in Christ's kingship in Jerusalem — and we savor it two thousand years later.

The lesson? Learn how to "waste" money, time, clothes, and food on Christ. We do this at Mass, but in so many other ways, too, like serving the poor, going on retreats, and doing prayerful study. When we practice this holy wastefulness, Jesus will ride into our lives and we'll be more deeply members of his kingdom.

Please reach out to Governor Walz and our state legislators

In Minnesota, we have a statute that outlines our state government's commitment to providing educational aids such as textbooks, health services and counseling support that every school pupil in the state will share equitably in education benefits and therefore further assure all Minnesota pupils and their parents freedom of choice in education (Minn. Statute 123B.40). This has been the tradition in our state for decades, and we hope it will continue.

Currently, Governor Walz needs to make some budget cuts for the upcoming fiscal year. His current proposal includes cutting nonpublic public aid to include our school nurse, counseling services, and textbooks aid.

Here is the funding that Sacred Heart would receive next year:

Textbooks \$20,877

School nurse \$13,420

Guidance counselor \$16,502

If this funding is taken away, we would need to come up with an additional \$50,799 per year. These funds would have to either come from the school families through increases in tuition or additional fundraising efforts.

What can you do? First, you can contact Gov. Walz's office at 651-201-3400 and respectfully urge him to drop this proposal. You can do the same with your state legislators. Go to the MN Catholic Conference website at www.mncatholic.org

Removing nonpublic aid would unfairly target non-public school students and it would have a direct impact on our Sacred Heart community. Please join me in telling the Governor and our legislators to protect funding for nonpublic school students.


