



Easter Joy

Thank you for joining us at the Church of the Sacred Heart for our 114th Easter celebration as a parish of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. I am especially grateful since only five weeks ago I had surgery to replace my right knee. I was able to celebrate two of the four Masses for Palm Sunday, and today I am celebrating two of the three Easter Sunday Masses. I offer my thanks to all who have prayed for my recovery, participated in the meal train, and for Donald and Nancy Narr who have taken turns taking me to physical therapy sessions. My thanks as well to all who have made our Lenten and Holy Week celebrations so beautiful. I thank those who have decorated our Church, the musicians, altar servers, lectors, distributors of Holy Communion and ushers and the many visiting priests who filled in for me during my recovery.

As we come to Mass this day it is important to remember that our worship at Mass every Sunday is rooted in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. As St. Paul put in his first letter to the nascent Church in Corinth:

"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain, and your faith is in vain."

1 Corinthians 15:14

Friends, the ancient Easter greeting is meant to give us joy: "He is risen! Christ is truly risen!" Our presence at Mass for Easter likewise is a sign of our faith in the resurrection of Christ. There is an old saying. What Easter is for the year, Sunday is for the week. The Christian Sabbath is not on Saturday, the seventh day as it is for the Jews, but rather falls on Sunday, the first day of the week, because it was early on Sunday morning that our Savior rose victoriously from the dead. In His resurrection is our resurrection. In His victory is our victory. The resurrection shows us that sin and death can do its worst, but God still conquers. In His resurrection hope for a new life is born. That new life begins when the Lord dwells in our souls in grace. While it is true that here on earth, we all have challenges and trials in life that we face, nevertheless, the Resurrection of Christ firmly fixed in our hearts teaches us to live always with confidence. Regardless of the circumstances in life we face Christ will have His victory. This is a victory He accomplished not for Himself but for you and for me. Let the risen Lord reign then in our hearts filling us with joy.
