Habemus Papam! - We have a Pope!

As you all know our Heavenly Father called Pope Francis into the next life on Easter Monday, April 21st. The passing of Pope Francis set in motion a centuries old process and period of time that enabled both a fitting time of mourning for the late Holy Father, and then the beginning of a time of discernment which culminated in the Conclave to elect a successor of St. Peter, a new Bishop of Rome, and the Vicar of Christ on earth.

Here at The Church of the Sacred Heart, we strove to hold in prayer the soul of Pope Francis. We set up a picture of the late Holy Father, accompanied by candles which represented our prayers for him. We also set up the papal bunting of mourning in black on the doors of the Church. As he was called to meet Christ the judge of all the living and the dead to give an account of his stewardship as successor of St. Peter and Vicar of Christ on earth and indeed for the entirety of his life, we pray that this Pope who called us to be mindful of the Mercy of God was likewise granted a merciful judgment. We pray that the treasury of the merit whose source is Christ himself will aid Pope Francis to enter into the halls of the heavenly kingdom wherein the Father's House there are many mansions!

Beginning with the funeral of Pope Francis, the nine days of mourning known as the "*Novemdiales*" with Masses offered each day for the repose of the soul of the late Holy Father formerly began. At the same time the College of Cardinals, including those eligible to vote as well as those over age 80 gathered in general congregations to discuss the needs of the Church. Every Cardinal was afforded the opportunity to address their brother cardinals on what each of them saw as the needs going forward. This period of time enabled them to get to know one another better, to pray together, and to enjoy fraternity and conviviality over meals. It was during this time that the Cardinals began to discern who was truly *Papabile* – that is Popeable.

Among them was a relatively recent Cardinal, called to serve in the Roman Curia in the later part of 2023. A man born in the United States in Chicago, who after obtaining a degree in Mathematics from Villanova in 1977 decided to forego Havard Law School so he could join the Order of St. Augustine, known as the "Augustinians." He would make vows and be ordained a priest in the early years of the Papacy of Pope St. John Paul II. As an Augustinian friar he would do mission work in South America for many years. He would come back to the United States and serve as vocation director and ultimately the Superior General of the Augustinian order. In this role he traveled the world over and came to know Pope Benedict XVI as well as the Cardinal Archbishop of Buenos Aires, Jorge Mario Bergoglio, who would later become Pope Francis. In an interview he gave some time ago, Robert Francis Prevost even mentioned after the election of Pope Francis that due to some difficult meetings with him when he was Archbishop of Buenos Aires that he was grateful he would never be made a Bishop.

Pope Francis must have remembered those meetings differently, for in 2015 he made Robert Francis Prevost Bishop of Chiclayo in Peru, where he would serve for nine years. So grateful were the Peruvians for his service that they granted him dual citizenship. Pope Francis then called Robert Francis Prevost to Rome in 2023 to serve as the Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops. This dicastery leads the process that ultimately leads to new bishops begin appointed in the various dioceses of the world and then made him a Cardinal just one and half years ago. Who could have predicted that this son of the south side of Chicago, a priest of the Augustinian order with extensive missionary experience, experience as head of his order and later a bishop in Peru and then a Cardinal would be elected on May 8th, 2025, to be the 267th successor of St. Peter and 268th Bishop of Rome? This is what has come to pass, and now we have Pope Leo XIV. He is the first pope born in the United States of America, and from the Midwest too! We set up the festive papal bunting in yellow and white just in time as the white smoke billowed from the Sistine Chapel on the day he was elected.



I pray and hope we will be able to receive him in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis when he comes back home. We will be praying with him and for him as he begins his pontificate. May Pope Leo XIV always respond to the Lord's command to tend and feed the flock of Christ with the words, I love you, Jesus.
